June 15-17: Final artifact due

## Narrative: Your final narrative should include:

- 1. Describe an appropriate question addressing a global issue or concern (e.g. water scarcity, ethnic conflict, human rights) and why you chose this question. (1 paragraph)
- 2. Describe your original thesis as an answer or response to this question. This is your working hypothesis. (1 paragraph)
- 3. Describe your action plan to investigate the issue. The action plan should incorporate but is not limited to the following:
- a. A variety of sources consulted (annotated bibliography of at least 7 reputable sources attached) (1 paragraph total)
- b. Communication with 1 or 2 experts or community membrers and why you chose those them. (proof of your communication attached) (1 paragraph)
- 4. Summarize and analyze the state of the problem based on the above. (2 paragraphs)
- 5. Formulate a conclusion in comparison to your original thesis (1 paragraph)
- 6. Propose 1 or 2 solutions or possible ways to address the problem (1-2 paragraphs)
- 7. Describe your artifact, why you chose this medium and how you would implement it and share with stakeholders for further impact. (1 paragraph)
- 8. A final reflection of the process, including your favorite and/or most difficult part, your successes, surprises, and obstacles. Also what you would do differently next time and suggestions for your teacher on how to implement/support the project. (1-2 paragraphs; attach all journal entries)

**Artifact**: Create an artifact that calls attention to the issue and incorporates your research. You may create your artifact in English or French.
